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# <u>LOGLINE</u>

*Starting at Zero* explores the power of investing in high-quality early childhood education so that all children and families have the opportunity to attain the American Dream.

# <u>SYNOPSIS</u>

*Starting at Zero* explores the power of investing in high-quality early childhood education so that all children and families have the opportunity to attain the American Dream.

The film brings together the voices of policymakers, educators, academics, business leaders, pediatricians, parents, and children. It features five current and past governors who are champions of early childhood education: Governors Steve Bullock of Montana, Kay Ivey of Alabama, and Ralph Northam of Virginia, as well as former Governors Jim Hunt of North Carolina, and Phil Bryant of Mississippi.

*Starting at Zero* examines the latest developmental brain science to demonstrate how essential the earliest years of learning are to maximize human potential. Key features of high-quality early childhood

learning environments and experiences are outlined and then brought to life as the film delves into the evolution of Alabama's #1 nationally ranked state Pre-K program.

Starting at Zero culminates with a call to governors across America for collective action: to set our nation on the path to future success through significant investments in high-quality early childhood education, both to support today's workforce, and to build the workforce of tomorrow. At the heart of the film is the affirmation that if children are given the opportunity to thrive in settings with caring, responsive adults, the returns to our society will be deep and long-lasting.

## DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

When I embarked on this project with the Saul Zaentz Charitable Foundation back in 2017, we did not set out to produce a feature-length documentary on early childhood education. We were interested in how the state of Alabama had consistently achieved the #1 nationally ranked state pre-K program, and wanted to create a playbook for how other states could establish similar programs in their own states. But once we started interviewing Secretary of Early Childhood Education Jeana Ross and other program leaders in Montgomery, we realized there was so much more to the story—that it had roots in North Carolina, Georgia, and Mississippi, and other threads in Oklahoma and Montana, Chicago and Omaha, and beyond.

Before we knew it, we'd traveled around the country pursuing this question of "what is high quality" in early childhood education? Also, how do you accomplish it, and why is it so critical to our nation's current and future success? Along our journey, we interviewed policymakers, educators, academics, business leaders, pediatricians, parents, and children—in rural and urban settings, red states and blue. The landscape of early childhood education in the United States is fragmented, but across this diversity of perspectives, we discovered so much commonality—a collective understanding of the importance of high-quality early learning, how to accomplish it, and sense of urgency to act. These conversations and shared themes became the backbone of *Starting at Zero*.

In a time when our social issues run deep, and our stakes high, film is a powerful medium for bringing together the voices of individuals who may never otherwise have the opportunity to connect—and discover common ground. When approached with a mindset of listening, learning, and curiosity, it's clear that there's a lot more that unites us than divides us. We hope that *Starting at Zero* will indeed encourage *"Reimagining Education in America,"* spark "aha" moments for our viewers, and drive collective action on early childhood education in states across the country. And that if we can rally around investing together in a hopeful future for children, families—and our nation—that we may begin to find common ground in other critical areas, as well.

It has been an honor and joy to partner with the Saul Zaentz Charitable Foundation on *Starting at Zero*. Of course, this film would not have been possible without the talent and great collaborative effort of our team, to whom I am deeply grateful: Executive Producer Alan H. Hammerman, Firestarter Interactive's Consulting Producer Lauren Gaffney, Director of Photography and Editor Matthew Ziegler, Associate Producer Annie Glidden, Assistant Cameramen Jake DeNicola and Alexander Sutula, Designer David Miller, and Music Composer Aaron Steinberg, as well as the organizations and individuals who believed in this work and helped guide its evolution. It's taken a village, and we could not have brought this vision to life without everyone's contributions. We view the film's launch not punctuation mark, but only the beginning of a shared conversation. Deep in my DNA I believe in the power of storytelling to help bridge the gap between the world as it is, and as we want and dream it can be, and hope to continue to tell stories and produce films to nurture that transformation.

## FILMMAKER BIOGRAPHIES

## Saul Zaentz Charitable Foundation, Producer

Saul Zaentz was a media entrepreneur in the music and film industry. He built the largest independent jazz record label in the world, Fantasy Records and, through the Saul Zaentz Company, became a prominent independent film producer. His creative activities in film resulted in 34 Academy Award nominations, the award of 22 Hollywood Oscars for those involved in the filmmaking process, including three for Best Picture. Zaentz's renowned works include the films *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, Amadeus, The English Patient* and *The Unbearable Lightness of Being*. Mr. Zaentz died in 2014.

Founded in 1997, the <u>Saul Zaentz Charitable Foundation</u> works to improve outcomes for poor and vulnerable minority citizens in the United States. The Foundation is deeply committed to creating standards of fairness and a level playing field for those living in poverty and adversity by supporting equal treatment through high-quality early childhood learning and improving K-12 and college graduation rates. In this regard, the Foundation supports innovations in scientific teaching methods and best practices. *Starting at Zero* is Foundation's second documentary film focused on early learning.
